#### Lecturer's Corner

#### How to be ready for the Master's Return

There is no better way to thank the Lord Jesus for the grace of Holy Communion than frequent reception of Communion—and repaying Jesus with Jesus. If you ask me what preparation you should do before receiving Holy Communion, I will answer: give your hearts to Jesus. If you ask me how to be grateful for the divine heart that Jesus gives you in Holy Communion, I will answer: give him yours. The Lord Jesus says: "whoever eats me, may they honor me, thank me, pray, and mortify themselves. Let them make a sacrifice, but first of all, let them live for me". As the Lord Jesus lives for us, we are to live for him.

Know that after receiving Holy Communion Christ is present in us, and that we have no better time to deal with the matter of our salvation. What would you do if someone, having invited you, neglected you without proper care? What are you hurrying after, what are you looking for outside of your Lord? He will teach you more than all books. If the Blessed Sacrament—that is, Jesus—is everything to us, is it not the most correct conclusion that we should be totally devoted to him? Each of us is to carry Jesus in Holy Communion, worship and honor him, become his own temple, and show him to the world through our works and zeal for the salvation of souls.

Ask for strength for one day. Live from one Holy Communion to another.

# A Christmas *Gift*: Life Insurance and a **NEW AGENT**

A survey from LIMRA (Life Insurance Marketing Research Association) found that nearly 60% of Americans have some kind of life insurance, but on the other hand, over half of those were underinsured.

So what does that have to do with the Knights? The historian, Christopher Kauffman, spent several years at the Supreme Office and at the Museum, researching the book that he wrote on the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our founding. That book, <u>Faith and Fraternalism</u>, notes on page 13, "...he [Fr. McGivney] was deeply interested in pursuing the topic of a Catholic fraternal insurance society among groups of Catholic laymen of New Haven." Then on page 35 Mr. Kauffman goes on, "...he [Fr. McGivney again] spent his energy in promoting the insurance feature...his emphasis on business was his pastoral concern for the social and financial security of the family."

Blessed Fr. McGivney lived both the social and the financial *insecurity* of a desperate family, with the breadwinner suddenly taken, that had to be supported. He left the seminary to work and support his mother and siblings. He didn't want other Catholic families to find themselves in such a predicament. That, and uniting men of faith, was the impetus for establishing our Order. Everyone who joined in those first years was insured; that was part and parcel of being in the organization. Now every member has a choice, and every member should know what we do, and how we do it.

Most don't want to think about life insurance, much less buy it, but you should <u>want to buy what life insurance</u> <u>provides</u>: no change in lifestyle for the survivors...in the house where they want to be. It'll pay for a daughter's wedding, a child's college education and much more. What does life insurance provide? Peace of mind, security, freedom from anxiety, a safeguard from the unknown!
