March 5th (Ash Wednesday) begins the Lenten season until sundown on Holy Thursday. During this season of Lent, according to the USCCB, "we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began a new life in Christ."

On Saturday, March 8th, we will be holding a men's retreat at the St. John Paul II National Shrine in Washington, DC. This retreat is open to all men in the parish, not just members of the Knights of Columbus Council 4522. As this is an annual event, we encourage everyone to try to attend for spiritual enrichment. Participants may choose to drive or carpool to the National Shrine, which will open at 10:00 AM and conclude at 5:00 PM. Lunch will be provided. We look forward to seeing you there!

Lecturer's Reflection for March

Clinging to the Words of Jesus and Mary

Do whatever he tells you (Jn 2:5). These words spoken by Mary, his mother, at the wedding at Cana resound to all Christians of all time...She did what she will always do from then on: she brought people's needs to her Son...Be told the servants, Fill the jars with water. We have to realize that from a human point of view, this instruction made no sense. The problem was not a lack of water but a lack of wine. The servants could easily have grumbled or outright refused. It was no easy job to fill these jars, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. It meant numerous trips out to the village well, hauling up and lugging back heavy bucketloads. Yet these servants, on the strength of Mary's word, obeyed Jesus...

How often the Lord tells people to do something that does not make sense in the natural realm, or that is outright impossible. He told the apostles to distribute a few loaves and fish to a crowd of thousands.....He told the man with the withered hand to do the one thing he could not do: Stretch out your hand....He told the lame man to do the impossible: Rise, take up your pallet, and walk....This kind of radical obedience has also been modeled by the saints. At Lourdes in 1858 Our Lady gave a seemingly nonsensical instruction to a young girl named Bernadette: "Go and drink at the spring and wash yourself in it." But there was no spring. So Bernadette in humble obedience bent down and, scraping mud from the ground, spread it on her face and drank of it...Some laughed at her, some cried with pity, some were angry.... Fresh water soon began to flow abundantly. A young boy drank of it and was healed of blindness in one eye. Since then, countless thousands have been healed through the waters at Lourdes.

How often the Holy Spirit gives us light impressions or promptings we ignore.... To see the Lord's healing power requires listening to him, choosing to be obedient, and trusting that he will lead us. ..Most of the Holy Spirit's promptings are very simple: Go talk to that

person. Call that person. Tell that man the Lord loves him and understands the pain he is going through. Ask the lady sitting over there if she would like prayer for anything. Repent of that sin that is blocking the Lord's work in your life. Even when we make mistakes, the Lord will use them for our humility and growth toward maturity. (Mary Healy)

March 25th FOUNDER'S DAY



Each March 25th, we celebrate Founder's Day, which marks the date on which the Knights of Columbus was granted its charter by the State of Connecticut in 1882 and which honors, in a particular way, our visionary Founder.

Blessed Michael McGivney was inspired to create a band of Catholic gentlemen, devoted to the principles of charity and unity — helping those in need; growing in faith and virtue as Catholic husbands and fathers; and providing financial security to families. The beatification of Father McGivney was a testament and affirmation of his spiritual vision—and we should each feel encouraged in realizing that vision to this day. For even if the challenges facing Catholic men have changed, the mission set forth by our Founder remains as relevant as ever.

Here's a fascinating question to ponder: What was Father McGivney like in person? What impression did he make upon people? Although he lived long ago, we do have some clues to the character and demeanor of this blessed priest.

His was "a priest's face, and that explains everything," wrote a fellow Connecticut priest whose one meeting with Father McGivney made a deep impression. "It was a face of wonderful repose; there was nothing harsh in that countenance, although there was everything that was strong ..."

We see those qualities of compassion and strength in the few photos we have of Father McGivney. He was a man on a mission who walked quickly, but he spoke slowly and always had time for his parishioners who needed a kind word or a sympathetic ear.


